From campouts to bike-a-thons to baptisms, our church's Pathfinders club is having an amazing year. Pathfinders is all about teaching youth that Christianity can be fun, according to club leader Marge Schwartz.

"Too often young people equate church and religion with things that aren't exciting," says Marge. "But Pathfinders sends the opposite message. It's all about having fun with other Christians while doing things that honor God."

Members must be at least 10 years old, and they attend meetings every other Sunday afternoon during the school year. They also head out of town on a regular basis to meet with other Pathfinder clubs and explore nature, grow in their faith, and make new friends.

According to Marge, the highlight of the club's year was when the young people were responsible for an entire church service this spring, known as Pathfinder Sabbath. Every club member was involved. Some read Bible verses, others prayed, and all helped with music. By presenting an entire service, the young people

learned that they are an important part of the church community and that they can really make a difference when they get involved.

"Weekend camping events are usually the other highlight of each Pathfinder year," says Marge. "Our club joins with hundreds of young people from other clubs around Northern California."



The first weekend camping trip last fall set the tone for the whole Pathfinder year. It rained for half of the weekend event in Mendocino, and other clubs

gave up and went home. "But our young people decided to stick it out, and enjoyed playing games and getting to know each while the rain poured down around them." WHAT CAN INSPIRE YOUNG PEOPLE

Paul tells us it was not fear of punishment or

hope of reward that made him pour his life out for Christ, but he said, "The love of Christ constrains us." God's love pushes, compels or motivates us to want to serve Him, because we begin to "comprehend with all the saints what is the width and length and depth and height" of His love.

We shall study that love for eternity. Our

We shall study that love for eternity. Our minds grasp so little of it now. The cross of Calvary reveals the depths of God's love for the lost. There Jesus, His Son, took upon Himself the second death of all the world. *The Desire of Ages tells us*,

"The Saviour could not see through the portals of the tomb. Hope did not present to Him His coming forth from the grave a conqueror, or tell Him of the Father's acceptance of the sacrifice. He feared that sin was so offensive to God that Their separation was to be eternal. Christ felt the anguish which the sinner

will feel when mercy shall no longer plead for the guilty race. It was the sense of sin, bringing the Father's wrath upon Him as man's substitute, that made the cup He drank so bitter, and broke the heart of the Son of God" (page 753).

He experienced all the demoninspired, painful emotions of eternal separation from His Father. Yet He was willing to give up His life forever, if necessary, to make life possible for us. When we start to get a sense of the cost of Christ's sacrifice on the cross, the heart is subdued, melted, captured. Under this type of motivation, we're willing to do anything for Jesus because in



the power of His love, His "yoke is easy and His burden is light."

Ultimately, God's love is the only motivation that will keep our young people from giving in to temptation. If Joseph's only reason for not committing adultery was fear of getting caught, he would have fallen hard. But instead he said, "How then can I do this great wickedness and sin against God?" He had sensed God's unconditional love, His grace, making it "easy" to say no and "hard" to give in. And this grace is wonderful because "It teaches us to say 'No' to ungodliness and worldly passions and to live self-controlled, upright and godly lives in this present age" (Titus 2:12, NIV).

It was a clear revelation of this pardoning love at Calvary that "cast out all fear" from the disciples and made them want to—not have to—tell the world about the gospel. It was this same Good News that motivated Mary Magdalene to pour out her whole life at the feet of Jesus. And it is this

same motivation that will one day soon bring the church to repentance and prepare it to receive the latter rain.

Teen members took part in two campouts this year. In the fall, they traveled to the Lava Beds



National Monument, which provides a beautiful venue for exploring God's creation. The trip was geared

On Sabbath, teens from all over Northern California gathered for a group worship service inside the mouth of a cave, making for a unique and memorable setting. They wore their uniforms for their baptisms, as their fellow club members stood at attention at the front of the church to show their support.


