## God Permits Trials and Tribulations

- 1) So we can see our weaknesses
- 2) Romans 5, 1 Peter 1:6-7:
  - a. To test our perseverance, character, hope, and faith
  - b. To “tune us up” at the University of Trials and Tribulations
- 3) 2 Corinthians 1:3-4: So others can be blessed through our experiences and our testimony
- 4) To teach obedience by facing the consequences of our actions
- 5) Psalms 119:67, 71: To prepare us for the time of troubles
- 6) 1 Corinthians 4:9: So all in the universe can see how bad sin is
- 7) To bring us to total dependence on Him

## How to Handle Trials and Tribulations

- 1) 1 John 5:14-15, Isaiah 26:3-4
  - a. Pray that His will be done, and fast
  - b. Prayer should change *us* (not others) to be at peace no matter what our circumstances or consequences
- 2) Romans 8:28: Realize and accept that there is good at the end for you and/or others
- 3) Proverbs 24:10
  - a. Remain calm, at rest, and at peace despite the storm
  - b. Peace of mind vs piece of your mind!
