## YOUR HOME IN THE NEW JERUSALEM By Paul Penno, Jr. February 28, 2009

Long before men ever dreamt of building great cities like Hong Kong, Bejing, Tokyo, London, Mexico City, and New York City as monuments to the pride, architectural wonder, financial stability, and cultural achievements of the nations, God revealed His city which is unlike any that would be or ever has been conceived by human intelligence.

Whenever God finishes a job it is always done well and complete. This was the case when He created the world and the souls in it in six days. It is the case when He will speak these words:

"And he said unto me, It is done. I am Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the end. I will give unto him that is athirst of the fountain of the water of life freely." Revelation 21:6.

All of creation originates from God and He is the goal of creation. All things are created for Him. We all have a hunger and thirst for God in our lives. This ambition can be perverted to self as in the case of those who drink of the intoxicating wine which Babylon serves for the purpose of deception. This cup pays out deadly earned wages. However, drinking from the water whose source is the fountain, Jesus Christ, is a thirst quenching free gift.

"He that overcometh shall inherit all things; and I will be his God, and he shall be my son." Revelation 21:7.

The one who is continually drinking of Jesus is an overcomer. He cannot but help but be an overcomer in that Jesus is the only one who can overcome sin in our lives. There is no hindrance to the Spirit of Christ. He just wants more and more of this limitless supply of water.

The inheritance of overcomers includes access to the tree of life (Rev. 2:7); escape from the second death (Rev. 2:11); the hidden manna, a white stone, and a new name (Rev. 2:17); rulership over the nations (Rev. 2:26-28); a walk with Jesus; and garments of white; their names retained in the book of life and acknowledged by the Father and angels (Rev. 3:4, 5); pillars in the temple with God's name written on them (Rev. 3:12); they sit with Jesus on His throne (Rev. 3:21). But more importantly, God is their Father and they are sons and daughters in His family.

"But the fearful, and unbelieving, and the abominable, and

murderers, and whoremongers, and sorcerers, and idolaters, and all liars, shall have their part in the lake which burneth with fire and brimstone: which is the second death." Revelation 21:8.

There are specific ones who are excluded from "no fly" list. The first on the list are the "fearful" because "perfect love casts out all fear" and these have not the *agape* love of God. They do not have that love because they have not faith. The sin of all sins is unbelief in Jesus Christ. From this one sin flows all the horrible torrents of human wickedness to follow.

They are "abominable." Their belief system has been derived from the doctrines of devils taught by Babylon. Such beliefs have permeated their very nature and thinking causing them to be corrupt to the core. They justify murders, whoremongering, sorcery, idolatry, and lying on the basis of their so-called Christian beliefs. They have been taught these things by the false Christ. There are apostate Christians whose morality today fully justifies them in murdering others, committing adultery and fornication, sorcery and spiritualism, idolatry—the worship and gratification of self—and lying both to themselves and others to justify their actions.

Because of their choice in unbelief in the true Christ they have chosen the lake of fire which is the second death. Rejection of the true Christ who died their wages of sin—eternal death—can only result in the same fate.

"And there came unto me one of the seven angels which had the seven vials full of the seven last plagues, and talked with me, saying, Come hither, I will show thee the bride, the Lamb's wife." Revelation 21:9.

The same angels who are dressed in white linen pouring out the seven last plagues are fitted to conduct us to the bridal procession. At the wedding it's all about the bride. Everyone is focused upon her radiant beauty. And now the Lamb wants us to focus upon His bride for the rest of this chapter.

"And he carried me away in the spirit to a great and high mountain, and showed me that great city, the holy Jerusalem, descending out of heaven from God." Revelation 21:10.

The Lamb is very proud of His beloved holy city. He had promised His disciples that He would "prepare a place for them." "In my Father's house are many mansions" (John 14:2). Now we behold this celestial urban space ship "descending out of heaven from God."

"Having the glory of God: and her light was like unto a stone

most precious, even like a jasper stone, clear as crystal." Revelation 21:11.

The first thing to be noted about this city is the source of its illumination. God is her light. When winging at night across "fly over" country, one may often see on earth's dark surface an illuminated city. What is the source of her power? On the shore of the Grand River stands a coal-burning power plant for the city of Grand Haven, Michigan. That is the source of its power. However, the source of power for the New Jerusalem is the most environmentally friendly generator that has ever been conceived. It is God Himself from whom there is no harmful pollution. The light which He produces is white-diamond like, clear as crystal.

"And had a wall great and high, and had twelve gates, and at the gates twelve angels, and names written thereon, which are the names of the twelve tribes of the children of Israel." Revelation 21:12.

When you visit certain great cities of the world, you always want to see their world-renown monuments. Washington, D. C. has the White House, Congress, and the Washington Monument. New York City has the Statue of Liberty and the Empire State Building. Paris has the Eiffel Tower and the Louvre.

The architecture of the New Jerusalem is a monument in itself. It will stir the imagination with awe and wonder. The twelve city gates are each one larger than the Arch de Triumph in Paris. Each gate is a memorial to the twelve patriarchs and tribes of Israel.

"On the east three gates; on the north three gates; on the south three gates; and on the west three gates." Revelation 21:13.

Everyone who enters the city will do so under one of the twelve gates, three on each of the four sides of the city.

"And the wall of the city had twelve foundations, and in them the names of the twelve apostles of the Lamb." Revelation 21:14.

The massive city walls rest upon twelve foundation-time capsules containing the names of the twelve apostles. God sees fit to memorialize their names written in stone for all to see. The faith of Jesus revealed to these apostles sent from God has stood the test of time on this old earth and it will endure throughout eternity.

"And he that talked with me had a golden reed to measure the city, and the gates thereof, and the wall thereof." Revelation 21:15.

Any construction supervisor worth his medal must engineer the project with precision to within millimeters. Nothing in this wall is out of plumb. "And the city lieth foursquare, and the length is as large as the breadth: and he measured the city with the reed, twelve thousand furlongs. The length and the breadth and the height of it are equal." Revelation 21:16.

The city is a perfect cube with twelve edges each exactly 1400 miles long. This would cover an area roughly from the Pacific Coast to the Mississippi River.

"And he measured the wall thereof, an hundred and forty and four cubits, according to the measure of a man, that is, of the angel." Revelation 21:17.

The thickness of the wall is 216 feet. This wall must support a height of 1400 miles upwardly soaring parapets. When visiting Chicago the Sears Tower is the highest building, a landmark that can be seen when flying into O'hare airport. It pierces into the sky topping out at 1707 feet, but it has nothing over the walls of the New Jerusalem.

"And the building of the wall of it was of jasper: and the city was pure gold, like unto clear glass." Revelation 21:18.

Cost is no factor in the construction materials of this city. The walls are completely see-through, being made of jasper clear as crystal. What a dazzling jewel the whole appearance must be! Indeed, the inner city is built out of "pure gold." So the yellowish hue of gold radiates outward through the translucent walls.

"And the foundations of the wall of the city were garnished with all manner of precious stones. The first foundation was jasper; the second, sapphire; the third, a chalcedony; the fourth, an emerald; the fifth, sardonyx; the sixth, sardius; the seventh, chrysolyte; the eighth, beryl; the ninth, a topaz; the tenth, a chrysoprasus; the eleventh, a jacinth; the twelfth, an amethyst." Revelation 21:19, 20.

The twelve foundations each memorializing the twelve apostles is composed of twelve precious quarried stones. King Solomon's mines had nothing in them in comparison with the mines out of which God's quarries His previous stones.

"And the twelve gates were twelve pearls: every several gate was of one pearl: and the street of the city was pure gold, as it were transparent glass." Revelation 21:21.

The gates of the patriarchal tribes are each one made of one solid pearl. That must be some big oyster to produce such a pearl! An oyster gets a little irritation of a grain of sand over which it secrets layer after layer which hardens into pearl-like material. Wonder of wonders God must have a tremendous Monterrey Aquarium somewhere in His universe that you are going to want to visit to see how these pearls are produced!

And where does God get all that gold just to pave the streets with? Men on this earth have sacrificed their lives and fortunes spanning the continent in the gold rush of California and the Klondike. They have panned streams in the foothills and denuded the hills in placerite mines just to find an illusive few grains of gold nuggets. The largest gold brick minted on Montgomery Street in San Francisco, 1857, went down with the "Ship of Gold" in the Atlantic. It was 80 pounds and was worth \$17,000.00 in its day, now worth \$10 million. And here gold is so plentiful in God's inventories that He uses it for paving stones as the Romans used quarried rock for paving stones on their ancient highway system.

"And I saw no temple therein: for the Lord God Almighty and the Lamb are the temple of it." Revelation 21:22.

We understand that there is a temple in that city now (Rev. 16:17).<sup>1</sup> When the city descends from heaven that temple is gone and God and the Lamb compose the temple. The reason being that the necessity for a heavenly sanctuary to make atonement for sin is no longer needed, hence the temple is gone from the city at the millennium. Jesus no longer needs to offer His sacrifice for the sins of the people. They no longer need the forgiveness of their sins and the cleansing power of His blood to overcome sin.

When we go to church in the New Jerusalem, God and the Lamb will be the house of worship. Oh, what a marvelous privilege it will be to worship truly, in the house of the Lord! To see the Lamb every Sabbath day and the cross will be a perpetual reminder as to whom we owe our redemption and restoration.

"And the city had no need of the sun, neither of the moon, to shine in it: for the glory of God did lighten it, and the Lamb is the light thereof." Revelation 21:23.

Since God and the Lamb are the source of light for the New Jerusalem the sun which rules the day and the moon which rules the night will be rendered useless within the city limits.

"And the nations of them which are saved shall walk in the light of it: and the kings of the earth do bring their glory and honor into it."

Revelation 21:24.

Upon entering the city everyone will be within the embrace of God's light. Since everyone of the redeemed is a king in the earth made new they will bring with them their entourage of "glory and honor" to combine with and be absorbed by the light of God and the Lamb.

"And the gates of it shall not be shut at all by day: for there shall be no night there." Revelation 21:25.

"It is in the city alone, probably, that there is no night. There will of course be days and nights in the new earth, but they will be days and nights of surpassing glory. The prophet, speaking of this time, says, 'Moreover the light of the moon shall be as the light of the sun, and the light of the sun sevenfold, as the light of seven days, in the day that the Lord bindeth up the breach of His people, and healeth the stroke of their wound.' Isa. 30:26. But if the light of the moon in that state is as the light of the sun, how can there be said to be night there? Answer. The light of the sun shall be seven fold; so that, although the night is as our day, the day will be sevenfold brighter, making a contrast between day and night there, equal to what there is at the present time."<sup>2</sup>

"And they shall bring the glory and honor of the nations into it." Revelation 21:26.

"The nations are the nations of the saved; and we are all kings in a certain sense, in the new-earth state. We possess a "kingdom," and are to "reign" forever and ever. But it appears from some of our Saviour's parables, as in Matt. 25:21, 23, that some will occupy in a special sense the position of rulers, and may thus be spoken of as kings of the earth, in connection with the nations of the saved. These bring their glory: and hence into the city, when, on the Sabbaths and new-moons, they there come up to worship. Isa. 66:23."<sup>3</sup>

"And there shall in no wise enter into it any thing that defileth, neither whatsoever worketh abomination, or maketh a lie: but they which are written in the Lamb's book of life." Revelation 21:27.

When Jesus referred to "the abomination of desolation, spoken of by Daniel the prophet, stand in the holy place" (Matt. 24:15), he had a twofold application in mind both to the near future when Rome would destroy the temple, and when in the far distant future the

greater abomination would take place of the papacy's attempt to garner the worship of the world from Jesus and His sanctuary in heaven. Such man-made worship could only lead to abominable apostasy and unspeakable acts of violence. Such defiling, disgusting, unclean acts would all be based upon lies. Such are excluded from the list of entrance into the holy city.

"And he showed me a pure river of water of life, clear as crystal, proceeding out of the throne of God and of the Lamb." Revelation 22:1.

The city by the Bay is a jewel on the West coast of a great nation. Surrounded by mountains and water of natural beauty, it stands out like an island as a monument of human achievement born during the gold rush.

God's great city has a Central Park unlike that of New York City. At the head of it stands the throne of God and the Lamb. In the very heart of God's city the very focal point from which all the streets radiate outward, the grand circle in the center is the throne and the cross—the sacrificed Lamb.

This is the headwaters of the great River of Life. Here you have the Father, the Lamb, and the Holy Spirit. It's amazing that this river does not start out as does the Mississippi in upper Minnesota as a small stream that one can cross on flag stones by foot. This is a grand and broad river at its very source. It's headwaters coming from the city itself indicates an amazing attribute of its waters. They are crystal clear. You can drink from these waters without using purification tablets or filtration system. They are crystal clear.

"In the midst of the street of it, and on either side of the river, was there the tree of life, which bare twelve manner of fruits, and yielded her fruit every month: and the leaves of the tree were for the healing of the nations." Revelation 22:2.

The General Sherman tree stands 275 ft, the largest living organism, of all the monarchs of the forest. The fourteen-story, fifty foot wide, Disney tree of life, is a theme park man-made wonder. God's tree of life is unlike any tree on this earth. Its base spans the waters of the great River of Life rising up over Central Park.

It was this tree which Adam and Eve shunned in preference for

the tree of the knowledge of good and evil.<sup>4</sup> As a consequence God restricted their access to eating of the tree of life otherwise the eating of it would have immortalized sin. That tree was later transplanted in heaven and incorporated into the landscaping of the New Jerusalem.

This amazing tree produces twelve different kinds of fruit monthly throughout the year. When granted access to this tree, it will sustain life for the redeemed for ever. We will make regular visits to this tree, and the river, and this wonderful park. It will be a perpetual reminder to us that we are sustained by God. We are not selfperpetuating immortal beings. We are immortal because of the gift of God in Christ Jesus.

Why are the leaves of the tree needed for "the healing of the nations"? There will be no disease or deformity in the new earth. The leaves of the tree will be for the ongoing service to the nations of promoting their health and longevity.

"And there shall be no more curse: but the throne of God and of the Lamb shall be in it; and His servants shall serve Him." Revelation 22:3.

The curse fell upon Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden when they were banned from access to the tree of life and communion with God resulting in the wages of sin which is eternal death. Jesus bore the curse of death in order to restore fellowship with God. The fellowship which man enjoyed in Eden with God will be restored in the earth made new.

"And they shall see His face; and His name shall be in their foreheads." Revelation 22:4.

A warm up exercise to get acquainted with fellow classmates is to stare into the face of a seatmate for two minutes. It is almost impossible. It's like looking into the soul of another. I dare say that we now could not look into the face of God, but when we are changed we shall have that privilege to see Him face to face without shame. To have the divine name in their foreheads is a symbol of ownership. They are consecrated to Him.

"And there shall be no night there; and they need no candle,

neither light of the sun; for the Lord God giveth them light: and they shall reign for ever and ever." Revelation 22:5.

Although there is no sun in the New Jerusalem because God is the light source, it does not mean that the sun and moon will not exist to mark the times and seasons outside the city in the new earth. "And it shall come to pass, that from one new moon to another, and from one Sabbath to another, shall all flesh come to worship before me, saith the Lord" (Isa. 66:23).

"In the City of God 'there shall be no night." None will need or desire repose. There will be no weariness in doing the will of God and offering praise to His name. We shall ever feel the freshness of the morning and shall ever be far from its close. . . . The light of the sun will be superseded by a radiance which is not painfully dazzling, yet which unmeasurably surpasses the brightness of our noontide. The glory of God and the Lamb floods the Holy City with unfading light. The redeemed walk in the sunless glory of perpetual day."<sup>5</sup>

"And, behold, I come quickly; and my reward is with me, to give every man according as his work shall be." Revelation 22:12.

There are no conversions during the seven last plagues or at the battle of Armageddon when Christ comes to deliver His people. The determination has already been made regarding the sheep and the goats. The reward is to be gathered up into the air with Jesus in immortal life and incorruption.

We are saved by the blood of the Lamb. The faith of Jesus saves. We are not saved by our works. It is His "faith which worketh by love" (Gal. 5:6), in us. "We are His workmanship" (Eph. 2:10). These works are the outward evidence of an inward principle of God's love. Actually, the righteous will be oblivious to these works and will consider themselves unworthy. However, God takes note and rewards them appropriately.

"Blessed are they that do His commandments, that they may have right to the tree of life, and may enter in through the gates into the city." Revelation 22:14.

Here is the final beatitude of the Revelation. Christ is the perfect law of liberty. The blessing of commandment-keeping is Christ in the heart by faith. The ten commandments are new covenant promises in Him.

These ten commandments are the name of God written on the

forehead. They are the keycard to the security system at the gates of the New Jerusalem.

"And the Spirit and the bride say, Come. And let him that heareth say, Come. And let him that is athirst come. And whosoever will, let him take the water of life freely." Revelation 22:17.

The invitation to come and drink of the river of life comes from all quarters. The Holy Spirit bids us come. The bride of Christ bids us come. And those who respond are to bid others to come and drink. If you sense your need for a thirst quencher, then come. Jesus invited the woman at the well to drink the water that he would impart and she would never thirst again and "the water that I shall give him shall be in him a well of water springing up into everlasting life" (John 4:14).

Robert Lowry, thirty-eight, ministered in New York City during that terrible period in 1864 when the plague was sweeping away multitudes of citizens. When he wasn't visiting sick members of his Hanson Place Baptist Church, he was conducting funerals. One hot July day, Lowry himself was near collapse, exhausted, dispirited. Reaching for a scrap of paper, he began composing a poem; then, at his organ, he composed the music for it. It spoke of his hope to meet his suffering and dying parishioners in heaven, down by the River of Life.

> Shall we gather at the river, Where bright angel feet have trod? With its crystal tide forever Flowing by the throne of God?

Yes, we'll gather at the river, The beautiful, the beautiful river; Gather with the saints at the river That flows by the throne of God.
